


Your contribution is used for political purposes, and is not tax deductible as a charitable contribution for federal income tax purposes. Participation in CornPAC is voluntary and you may refuse to contribute without reprisal. You must be a U.S. citizen or carry a green card to contribute to CornPAC.

Federal law requires us to use our best efforts to collect and report the name, mailing address, occupation and name of employer of individuals whose contributions exceed \$200 in a calendar year.

CornPAC can only accept contributions from members of NCGA. (State affiliate members are considered members of NCGA.) Members may contribute a maximum of \$5,000 per calendar year.




CornPAC provides support to federal candidates who have a demonstrated record of supporting agricultural interests.
